Dear Parents and Carers,

YEAR 6 – WW2 TOPIC

For our topic on WW2, we would like to give the children the opportunity to investigate the impacts of the war on their local area, so are planning two trips.

On the morning of Tuesday 16th January, we will be taking the children on a tour around important sites in Kenilworth. We will visit St John's Church, Abbey End and Abbey Fields. We will discuss the impact of the war on Kenilworth and explore some air raid sites. The children should wear school uniform please. We will be walking, so please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather, i.e. waterproof coats and warm clothing.

We would appreciate some parent helpers for this trip. If you are able to accompany us and have a current DBS certificate, please speak to one of us (or to Mrs Morris or Mrs Weir in the office).

On Monday 29th January, we are hoping to visit Goodrest Farm, where a WW2 gun emplacement is situated. We will travel to the farm by coach, leaving school at 9.15am and returning at approximately 10.30am. Once again, the children should wear school uniform, but will need waterproof coats and warm clothing. It would also be advisable to bring a pair of wellies or walking boots.

There will be no charge for either of these trips. We already have your permission for your child to participate (via the school activities parental consent form), so **this letter is for information only.**
