Maths Focus

Key Areas of Learning:

- To count to and across 100.
- To read and write numbers in digits and words (0 to 20).
- To count in multiples of 2 and 10.
- To read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) symbols.
- To solve number problems with number and place value.
- To represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.
- To describe position using everyday language, e.g. top, middle, bottom, in front of, between, near, inside.

Knowledge and Understanding

- Learning to use various resources to find information.
- Learning to make structures more stable so they are freestanding through exploration and assembly.

- Learning to describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.
